Participants will learn how to recognize the signs of an overdose, safely administer naloxone, and respond effectively in emergency situations. The opioid epidemic has become a public health crisis, affecting individuals, families, and communities across the globe. This course provides an overview of the opioid epidemic, its origins, and its impact on society.
